What is a Credit?

•Most courses taken at CEC counts as **one credit** (except Math 10 and English 10 Plus)

•All students require a **minimum** of **18 credits** to graduate

What is a Semester?

•Two semesters per year (Sept-Jan, Feb-June). Exams at end of each semester.

•Four courses per semester.

•Four **70 minute periods** per day.

•Up to 8 credits per year (9 for those who take Music band)

 Designed to prepare students for successful transitions from high school to work, a career path, or college or university.

Application Process for O2

1. **Application** – student applies in grade 9 year by March 8th, 2024

2. Interview by O2 team

3. 20 Students will be accepted with potential for reserved seat at NSCC

Career Exploration Program- CEP

•Three-year program allowing students to earn Nova Scotia High School Diploma while acquiring occupational skills with a small class setting.

•Shop options:

•**Food Service** (Food Preparation 10/ Food Technology 10, Food Science 12, Service Trades 10, Culinary Trades 11, Co-op 11, Co-op 12(2))

•Property Services (Skilled Trades 10, Building Systems Technology 11/12 Building System Maintenance 12, Transportation Trade 11, Manufacturing Trades 11, Co-op 11, Coop 12(2))

•Ideal for students who like **hands-on learning** and wish to take a **trade** in college or **apprentice** after graduation

•4 week mandatory **work placement in grades 11 and 12** (3 coop credits toward graduation)



Highlights of the program include... •Hands-on learning

•On-the-job training during work placement

•Opportunity to acquire First Aid, Food Handlers Certificate and WHMIS

 Experience for resume toward college and/or workforce

•Small class size (typically maximum of 20)

Application Process for CEP

Application (due March 8nd, 2024)

Interview prior to admission

Register for classes during online registration first

High Skills Major in Arts

NEW certificate program beginning in 2024-25

Five components:

- Take at least three arts courses from the approved list
- Complete at least one Co-op credit in an arts environment
- Participate in community based learning opportunities
- Complete a minimum of 6 training certificates
- Complete a portfolio reflecting on the above experiences

Integrated French

Integrated French students may choose one of two options: •Pre-IB <u>OR</u> •Academic

<u>Six French credits</u> are required for a French Integrated certificate; 3 Languages courses + 3 other Fr courses. **Students must earn a minimum of two French courses each year**

Non-Pre-IB will need to take Fre Int 10 & Arts Dra 10 in Grade 10, Fre Int 11 and Etudes Can Cont. 11 (and/or Mode de Vie 11) in Grade 11, and Fre Int 12 and Histoire Planetaire 12 or Geographie Planetaire 12 in Grade 12. Pre-IB Histoire 10 is also an option for those interested.

If you plan to take IB in grade 11, students are **strongly recommended** to take the **Pre-IB Program**:

Certificate in Fine Arts Program

•For students interested in a career or secondary education in cultural industries.

 Students must complete at least 5 courses in Fine Arts to be eligible for the Fine Arts Certificate

Math Essentials 10 Grad

Math at Work 10 Grad

Math 10 (Full year, 2 credits) Academic

CEC Pre-IB Math 10 (Full year, 2.5 credits) Academic

Ask your grade 9 teacher about which course may be most appropriate for you

Math Essentials 10

Basic math skills with a very practical approach

For students struggling significantly with Math 9

One-semester course with no formal exam

Also choose Learning Strategies 10 if identified by your junior high as needing extra support

Math at Work 10

More challenging math concepts, but practical

For students meeting outcomes of Math 9 but who have difficulty with abstract concepts such as algebra

Students will need to keep up with classwork, and regularly assigned homework

One-semester course

Also choose Learning Strategies 10 if identified by your junior high as needing extra support

Math 10

Abstract math concepts including algebra will be covered

For students with a solid understanding of concepts in Math 9, good number sense and algebra skills

Full year course completed in June (2 credits –one math, one 'other from Science or Tech')

Homework is assigned on a regular basis

Full-year course with a Provincial Exam worth 20% of the final grade

Also choose Learning Strategies 10 if identified by your junior high as needing extra support or if you believe you will be challenged by Math 10

Math 10 Pre-IB

Abstract math concepts, lots of algebra

For students who excel in Math 9 with strong problem solving skills

Fast paced course covering all topics in Math 10 in addition to the more advanced topics necessary for advanced math courses. Students will have approximately 30 minutes of math homework every night.

Full-year course with a Provincial Exam worth 20% of final grade

If you plan to take Pre-Cal, you should take this course

English 10 Levels

- Language & Literature 10 Academic
- English 10 Academic
- English 10 Plus (Full year course, 2 credits)
- English 10 IPP

Talk to your grade 9 teacher about which course may be most appropriate for you

Graduation Requirements

•TOTAL OF 18 CREDITS to earn High School Diploma:

•3 ENGLISH (one at each grade level)

- •3 MATH (one at each grade level)
- •2 SCIENCES (Sci10 + one from Bio11, Phy11, Chem11 or other approved Science course)
- •1 CANADIAN STUDIES (MKS11, ACS11, or COCAS11)
- •1 FINE ARTS (Art, Music, Dance, IFA or Drama)
- •1 PHYS. ED. (PheAL, Dance, Phys.Ed, Yoga, Martial Arts, Exercise Science, or Phys. Ed. Leadership)
- •1 OTHER from Science or Tech

1 GLOBAL STUDIES (Global Hist12, Global Geo12, Global Pol12)
 •No more than 7 grade 10 credits towards 18 mandatory
 •Minimum 5 grade 12 credits

Grade 10 Course Selection

English 10 (Plus, Academic, Pre-IB)

Math (Essentials, At Work, Academic, Pre-IB)

Science (Academic, Pre-IB, Pre-BI IMM)

Fine Arts 10 (Art, Band, Vocals, Strings, Drama (Fr), Dance, IFA*)

2 or 3 Electives (suggestion to take a grade 10 Social Studies course such as History or Geography to prepare for grade 11 level)

Must sign up for 8 credits

Plus**2 ALTERNATE COURSES

Course Changes

Students are choosing courses for the full school year

If you fail a course first semester, you cannot repeat it in the second semester

Course Changes will occur on a case by case basis. See your school counsellor.

Level Changes

A different level (usually easier)

If you are struggling in a course, see Ms. Gloade, your grade 10 school counsellor

Try to make the level change as soon as possible, pending room in the requested course
