### **O2-Options & Opportunities**

•A high school program that offers students more experiential learning with a career focus. (Must enter in grade 10)

•Designed to prepare students for successful transitions from high school to work, a career path, or college or university.

•Commits to learn in community and workplace settings

•Taking academic English or higher and Math at Work or higher



•Highlights of the program include:

•**small class sizes** for Community Based Learning 11, Career Development 10, English 10 and Co-op classes

•field trips to community businesses and professional settings

field trips to post-secondary institutions such as the NSCC

•preferred seat for some programs at the NSCC

 many guest speakers from various occupations in our community

#### **Application Process for O2**

1. **Application** – student applies in grade 9 year by March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025

#### 2. Interview by O2 team

3. 20 Students will be accepted with potential for reserved seat at NSCC

4. Register for classes during online registration first

#### **Career Exploration Program- CEP**

•Three-year program allowing students to earn Nova Scotia High School Diploma while acquiring occupational skills with a small class setting.

•Shop options:

•Food Service (Service Trades 10, Food Science 12, Dining Guest Services 11/12, Co-op 11, Co-op 12(2))
•Property Services (Building Systems Tech. 11/12, Building System Maintenance 12, Skilled Trades 10, Transportation Trade 11, Manufacturing Trades 11, Co-op 11, Co-op 12(2))

•Ideal for students who like **hands-on learning** and wish to take a **trade** in college or **apprentice** after graduation

•4 week mandatory **work placement in grades 11 and 12** (3 co-op credits toward graduation)



Highlights of the program include... •Hands-on learning

•On-the-job training during work placement

•Opportunity to acquire First Aid, Food Handlers Certificate and WHMIS

 Experience for resume toward college and/or workforce

•Small class size (typically maximum of 20)

•Interview prior to admission

•**Register** for classes during online registration first

## **Integrated French**

Integrated French students may choose one of two options: •Pre-IB <u>OR</u> •Academic program

•<u>Six French credits</u> are required for a French Integrated certificate; 3 Languages courses + 3 other Fr courses. **Students must earn a minimum of two French courses each year**

#### International Baccalaureate Diploma - IB

- •Grade 11 & 12 years
- •Students must be ambitious and have above average reading/academic ability
- •Very well known at universities in Canada and around the world
- •Focus on research, writing, critical thinking
- •IB students may also complete French Immersion Diploma and a bilingual IB diploma
- •May give advanced credit at university for higher level courses taken

#### High Skills Major in Arts

For students interested in a career in the arts
Must take one from any of the following: Art dramatique 10, Dance 11, Drama 10, Music 10, or Visual Arts 10 in grade 10
Complete at least two other approved arts courses and one co-op in an arts environment
Participate in community based learning opportunities

Complete a minimum of 6 training certificatesComplete a portfolio

### Certificate in Fine Arts Program

•For students interested in a career or secondary education in cultural industries.

 Students must complete at least 5 courses in Fine Arts to be eligible for the Fine Arts Certificate

# English 10 Levels

- •Language & Literature 10 Academic
- •English 10 Academic
- •English 10 Plus (Full year course, 2 credits)
- •Talk to your grade 9 teacher about which course may be most appropriate for you

## Math Courses

- Math Essentials 10 Grad
- Math at Work 10 Grad
- Math 10 (Full year, 2 credits) Academic
- CEC Pre-IB Math 10 (Full year, 2.5 credits) Academic

# Math Essentials 10

- Basic math skills with a very practical approach
- For students struggling significantly with Math 9
- One-semester course with no formal exam

## Math at Work 10

- More challenging math concepts, but practical
- For students meeting outcomes of Math 9 but who have difficulty with abstract concepts such as algebra
- •Includes math concepts used in many skilled trades courses
- Students will need to keep up with classwork, and regularly assigned homework
- •Will have a culminating assessment

## Math 10

•Abstract math concepts including algebra will be covered

•For students with a solid understanding of concepts in Math 9, good number sense and algebra skills

•Full year course completed in June (2 credits –one math, one 'other from Science or Tech')

•Homework is assigned on a regular basis

•Full-year course with a Provincial Exam worth 20% of the final grade

# Math 10 Pre-IB

- Abstract math concepts, lots of algebra
- For students who excel in Math 9 with strong problem solving skills
- Fast paced course covering all topics in Math 10 in addition to the more advanced topics necessary for advanced math courses. Students will have approximately 30 minutes of math homework every night.
- Full-year course with a Provincial Exam worth 20% of final grade
- If you plan to take Pre-Cal, you should consider this course

## Graduation Requirements

#### •TOTAL OF 18 CREDITS to earn High School Diploma:

•3 ENGLISH (one at each grade level)

- •3 MATH (one at each grade level)
- •2 SCIENCES (one from Sci10, Biology, Physics, Chemistry and one other approved Science course)
- •1 CANADIAN STUDIES (Mks11, Acs11, CoCAS11)
- •1 FINE ARTS (Art, Music, Dance, IFA or Drama)
- •1 PHYS. ED. (PheAL, Dance , Phys.Ed, Yoga, Martial Arts, Exercise Science, Phys. Ed. Leadership)

•1 OTHER from Science or Tech

**1 GLOBAL STUDIES** (Global Hist12, Global Geo12, Global Politics 12)

•<u>No more than 7 grade 10 credits</u> towards 18 mandatory
 •<u>Minimum 5 grade 12 credits</u>
